

What is the BDEPTO? (Brown Deer Elementary Parent Teacher Organization)

The BDEPTO is made up of YOU and other moms and dads, uncles and aunts, grandparents, and friends who care about our children and their education. We have the common goal of creating a stronger school and educational experience for students at Brown Deer Elementary School. We want to strive to create an atmosphere where teachers and administrators can do their best work, allowing our children to do their best!

Here are some of the things we have accomplished and continue to do on a regular basis:

• On average, the BDEPTO raises \$20,000 annually

With these resources we have provided funding for all PTO sponsored social and educational activities, teacher and staff appreciation events, and annual monetary support to offset the cost of many field trips.

- 2) <u>BECOME A CLASSROOM COORDINATOR</u>. If you would like to be more involved directly with your child's classroom you can become a BDE Classroom Coordinator (CC). The BDEPTO likes to recruit 2- 3 Classroom Coordinators for each homeroom. CC's help assist the homeroom teacher and connect classroom families to one another by:
 - Creating a classroom contact list
 - Encourage volunteerism for classroom and school events
 - Organize teacher appreciation projects
 - Assist in classroom if needed

- Being a Classroom Coordinator for your child's teacher will not necessarily require time spent in the classroom or school. Ultimately, the needs of the teacher and students will define the opportunities available to each Classroom Coordinator.
